Our Lego Group aims to support children to develop their confidence participating in groups in a supportive and neurodiversity-affirming setting.

Participants will take on different building roles and work together to create a range of Lego creations. The structured build time allows for collaboration and problem-solving. Participants will also have a chance to get creative during free-build time. This unstructured build time allows for natural connections to develop.

Skills to be developed within Lego Group include:

- Affirming Social Skills – advocating for your own needs, recognising your strengths, understanding others' perspectives, problem solving with others, building natural social connections
- Emotional & Sensory Regulation – exploring strategies to regulate emotions and sensory needs within a supportive environment
- Perspective Taking – exploring others' perspectives, feelings, knowledge, and experiences which may influence their behaviour
- Communication – explaining and describing things to others, giving instructions, following instructions from others, asking for help and clarification, giving help and clarification

Who is this group suitable for?

- Children aged 8-12 years old who are interested in Lego.
- Children who would benefit from further language and emotional regulation support.
- Children who are interested in developing their confidence in group settings.
- Children who are interested in learning about Neurodiversity and how to advocate for themselves.
